Why do we write to Political Prisoners?

In this current era of rising facism, repression, and hyper individualism it feels more important than ever to stay connected with Political Prisoners. Behind prison walls lie our elders, our comrades, our friends. The state works very hard to keep people in prisons isolated from the outside world. We write to break down these walls. We write because someday it might be us on the other side. We write because once it was us on the other side. We write because together we are stronger. We write because receiving a letter can make a world of difference to the isolation that people feel behind prison walls. We write because we know that our liberation is intertwined.

What do I say in my letter?

For many of us it can feel anxious to write to someone we don't know. It is ok to keep it simple. Ask the person what they are interested in. Maybe you both like DnD, or Bob's Burgers, or science fiction, or plants, or outer space. I often will start a letter by talking about my pets. Keep in mind that all of your letters will be read by prison guards, so don't write anything that will incriminate you, or get the person responding to you in trouble – ie **don't ask questions about their case or their charges, or offer any political commentary, or talk about the verdict.** You can write out your favourite poem, talk about a walk you recently went on, or a movie you recently watched.

Montez Lee – BLM Uprisings. On January 14th, 2022, Montez Lee was sentenced to 10 years in prison, having pled guilty to one count of arson after facing multiple federal charges and being held without bond after his arrest. He is a dad to two kids, and spoke during his sentencing: *“Though I’ve been here for months fighting this case, I will not let it break my spirit or make me forget my principles. I stand with my community and my people. Until there is change and we are treated as equals, we will fight. No justice means no peace.”*

9.) **Mumia Abu-Jamal** is an award-winning journalist and was one of the founders of the Black Panther Party chapter in Philadelphia, PA. On December 9, 1981, Mumia, who moonlighted by driving a taxi, happened upon police who were beating his brother. During the melee, a police officer was shot and killed. Mumia is serving a life sentence.

2.) **Important things to keep in mind:**

Every institution is a bit different in what they allow in, but some general guidelines:

- Plain white 8.5 x 11 paper only.
- Only write in blue or black ink.
- **No stickers, glitter, or whiteout.**

Include first and last name* as well as ID number, page numbers, date, and a return address at the top of each sheet. (Many people will just receive the letter and not the envelope, and some sheets may be missing)

*Note: For Queer and Trans folks, prisons generally demand letters to be addressed to people's deadnames for them to get the letters. Then on the actual letter you can use their real name.

If you want to send in books, donate to canteen, etc, you can ask the person the best way to do that, or look on their support website if they have one. Often you need to send books to prisons directly from the publisher.

Who do I write to?

On the following pages we have addresses of some political prisoners you can write to. We do not currently know of any political prisoners in so-called Canada (please email us at halifaxanarchistblackcross@proton.me if you know of anyone), and so have focused on the U.S. Please note that as of Spring 2026 these addresses are current – and that people tend to be moved around. The Prarieland Defendents

In March of 2026 nine defendants were found guilty for participating in a Noise Demo in solidarity with ICE Detainees that occurred on July 4th 2025 at the Prarieland Detention Center in Alvarado, Texas, south of Fort Worth. This is the first case in the U.S. where “antifa” is considered domestic terrorism. Below are their addresses, as well as two who took non-cooperating plea deals and two with lesser charges. **Please note: the Prarieland defendents have asked that no one ask about the case or the charges or write any political commentary in their letters.**

Marius Mason is a transgender, environmental and animal rights activist. In 1999, in the name of the Earth Liberation Front (ELF) he set fire to a lab at the University of Michigan that was conducting research on genetically modified organisms (GMO). After Marius' husband turned states-evidence, Marius was threatened with a life sentence for the arson and other acts of sabotage. Marius pled guilty and was given an extreme sentence of nearly 22 years. No one was ever harmed in any of his actions.
