COUNT 2: PENAL CODE 71.02, ENGAGING IN ORGANIZED CRIMINAL ACTIVITY, 1ST DEGREE FELONY

On or about July 5th, 2025 in the 18th Criminal Judicial District of Johnson Texas, defendant, Susan Kent, with the intent to establish, maintain, or participate in a combination or in the profits of a combination or as a member of a criminal street gang, Susan Kent committed or conspired to commit Smuggling of Persons, a violation of Texas Penal Code 20.05, listed under subsection (17) of this statute.

Detective Background

1. I am a Detective employed and commissioned with the Johnson County Sheriff's Office ("JCSO") located at 1102 E. Kilpatrick St. Cleburne, TX 76031. I am assigned as a Detective in the Major Crimes section of the Criminal Investigations Division and have been since 2022. I am an advanced peace officer as granted by the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement ("TCOLE") and have been a peace officer for 7 years. I am responsible for conducting criminal investigations as they relate to crimes against person, more specifically, Homicide, Human Trafficking, Child Exploitation, and Terrorism related offenses. Additionally, I have worked other crimes such as Money Laundering, Narcotics, and Organized Crime. In the course of my investigations, I have executed numerous search warrants, arrest warrants, and grand jury subpoenas which led to the apprehension and prosecution of responsible parties.

2. I have received training in digital forensics as a certified Cellebrite Operator and Physical Analyst having forensically downloaded and analyzed numerous cellular devices. Additionally, I am a certified Special Weapons and Tactics ("SWAT") Operator and Basic Police Instructor, certified via Texas Commission on Law Enforcement ("TCOLE"). Prior to my time as a Detective, I was a background investigator and recruiter for the Johnson County Sheriff's Office. Prior to my time as a background investigator and recruiter, I served as a patrol deputy/officer for the Johnson County Sheriff's Office, Keene Police Department, and St. Marys Police Department (GA). I have a bachelor's degree in criminal justice with a concentration on homeland security from Southern New Hampshire University.

Case Background

3. The Prairieland ICE Detention Facility is located at 1209 Sunflower Ln. Alvarado, TX 76009, Johnson County, Northern District of Texas. The Prairieland ICE Detention Facility houses criminal aliens with final deportation orders from the United States. The current political climate in the United States has produced several "anti-ice" protests and demonstrations against law enforcement officers around the United States.

Organized Attack on Prairieland Detention Center

4. On July 4th, 2025, an Alvarado Police Officer was dispatched to the Prairieland Detention Center in reference to suspicious persons vandalizing vehicles and structures, discharging fireworks in the direction of the facility, and carrying AR-15 style rifles. Upon the Alvarado Police Officer's arrival, he contacted several armed subjects who proceeded to flee on foot, disregarding verbal commands. During the encounter, the Alvarado Police Officer was fired upon and struck twice by .556 rounds fired from at least two suspects; Based on updated information learned during the course of the investigation, evidence suggest one shooter. It is confirmed at least two additional suspects are responsible for vandalizing both government and personal vehicle in the parking lot of the facility. Additionally, the guard shack checkpoint was also vandalized; See attached images:

5. Contemporaneously, two DHS contracted corrections officers from Lasalle corrections were fired upon by at least one suspect; 20-30 spent .556 shell casings were observed leading investigators to believe the rounds fired at the corrections officers; According to the FBI's Federal Complaint, this was captured via CCTV and the Alvarado Police Officer's body worn camera; I was later informed by Texas Ranger Tyler Williamson that eleven (11) spent 5.56 shell casings were recovered from the scene of the offense, leading investigators to believe the initial 20-30 shell casings to be an inaccurate amount of spent rounds fired at Alvarado Police Officer and DHS corrections officers. Texas Ranger Williamson provided a more accurate depiction of the events he believes and have reason to believe occurred. Based on the evidence at the scene it appears the rifle with the binary trigger was pulled four (4) times, discharging 8 rounds, suspect retreated backwards, and pulled the binary trigger an additional two (2) times, discharging 3 more rounds, with the final round being stove piped or "jamming" the rifle before it was discarded.

Suspect Apprehension and Evidence Collection

6. Subsequent to the above-mentioned incident, a large law enforcement response was prompted. The Johnson County Sheriff's Office, Alvarado Police Department, Venus Police Department, Joshua Police Department, Texas Department of Public Safety, Texas Game Warden, and Mansfield Police Department all responded. During the course of the active scene all defendants indicated above were apprehended either on scene or within a reasonable and prudent distance of the scene. All defendants were wearing black, paramilitary style clothing. Multiple military style ballistic vests, Kevlar helmets, and firearms were located scattered across the crime scene and/or in vehicles associated with suspects arrested; See attached exhibits:

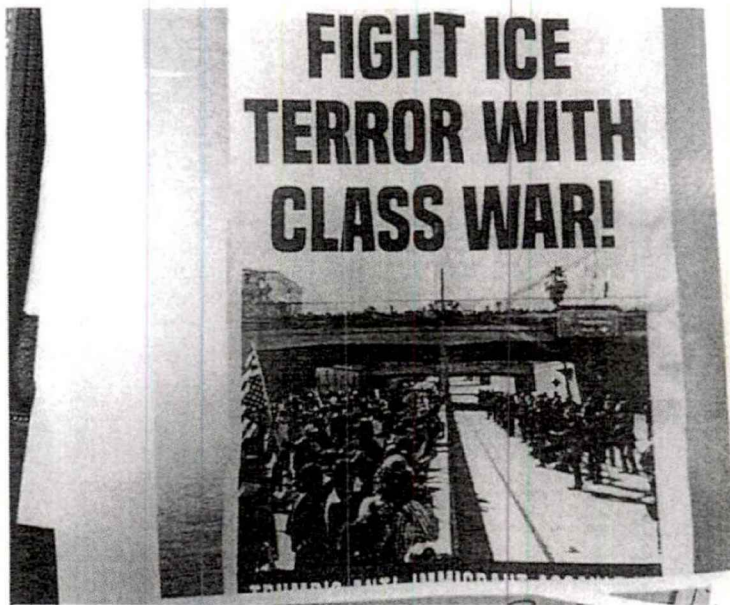

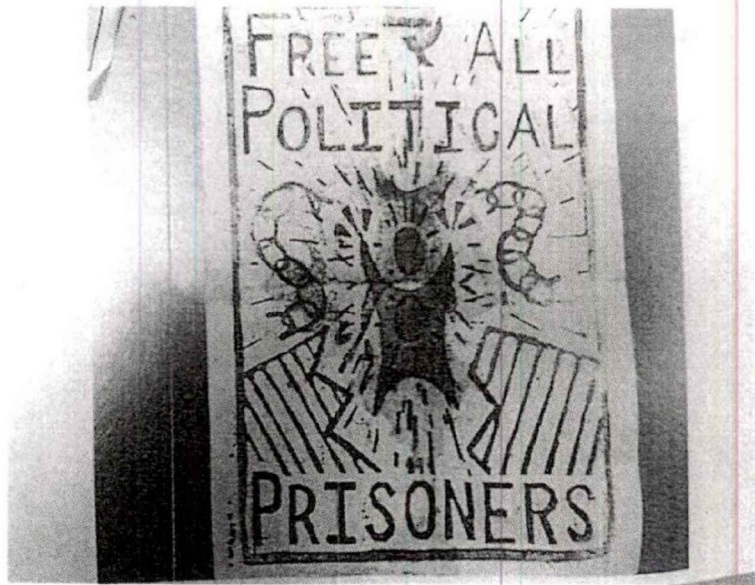

Traffic Stop & Suspect Connection

8. During my response to the scene of the offense, I was notified of a [REDACTED] van fleeing the scene offense. I conducted a traffic stop of said van near the intersection of US Highway 67 and North Cummings Rd; Roughly 1 mile from the Prairieland Detention Facility. During the traffic stop, I contacted co-defendant, Meagan Morris, DOB [REDACTED] AKA "[REDACTED] Morris." While speaking with Morris, Deputy Parsons identified a unholstered Sig Sauer Pistol in plain view on the passenger floor board of the vehicle. It is important to note Morris was dressed in all black attire and had the loaded magazine for the pistol located on the floor board in her pocket.

9. Morris was asked if there were any additional weapons in the vehicle to wit she stated there was an AR-15 style rifle in the backseat. Morris was asked to exit the vehicle and placed under investigatory detention; A terry frisk was conducted which is how I discovered the aforesaid pistol magazine in her pocket. In accordance with United States Supreme Court case law Carroll V United States AKA "motor vehicle exception" a warrantless probable cause search of the vehicle was conducted. The probable cause search of the vehicle elicited the discovery of two (2) black ballistic vests with loaded AR-15 magazines, a military/police style hand-held radio, an AR-15 style rifle, and a black ballistic Kevlar helmet.

10. Morris was read her Miranda warning which she initially waived her rights to an attorney and to remain silent. In summary, Morris provided the following information:

- She stated her friends asked her to watch the vehicle subsequent to a protest that occurred;
- She doesn't remember the names of her friends and met them online;
- She stated her cell phone was in one of her friends' care, custody, and control;
- She stated the "plan" was to "make some noise" at the gate;
- She stated the firearms in the vehicle are hers.

Benjamin SONG

11. On July 8th, 2025, I learned from ("FBI") Task Force Officer ("TFO") Casey Brashear that several of the firearms recovered at the scene were registered to one, Benjamin SONG, DOB [REDACTED] hereafter referred to as "SONG." ("TFO") Brashear informed me this was discovered via a Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms trace.

12. One of the AR-15 style rifles located at the scene of the original crime scene had a binary trigger. A binary trigger is used to "double" a regular rate of fire, essentially closing a gap between semi and fully automatic. The Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms ("ATF") confirmed the AR-15 style rifle had a binary trigger upon inspection. The Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms trace for this rifle showed to be owned by SONG.

13. On July 8th, 2025, an agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation ("FBI") spoke with one of the suspects at the Johnson County LEC, still under Miranda, continuing to waive her rights to remain silent and have an attorney present. The suspect told the Special Agent that defendant travelled with her to Prairieland Detention center on the night of the attack, July 4th, 2025. While waiting with the vehicles the suspect stated she heard the gunfire and knew it was from the rifle with the binary trigger; Firearm confirmed to be registered to SONG. The suspect knew the sound of gunfire from the binary trigger because he had accompanied SONG to the firing range on multiple occasions where defendant used the rifle with the Binary trigger.

14. Based on the facts and information contained above, I applied for and obtained three (3) State arrest warrants against SONG for Aiding the Commission of Terrorism, Aggravated Assault of Public Servant, and Engaging in Organized Criminal Activity. Contemporaneously, I learned ("FBI") obtained a Federal arrest warrants for SONG on charges of Attempted Murder of a Federal Officer; Discharging a Firearm During, in Relation to, and in Furtherance of a Crime of Violence.

Suspicious Person(s) Call for Service

15. On July 5th, 2025 at around 0837 hours, Johnson County Deputies responded to the Johnson County Jail in reference to two female subjects on site attempting to gather information about the individuals arrested on July 4th, 2025. Both females were identified as Lynette Sharp, DOB [REDACTED] and Susan Kent, DOB [REDACTED]; Lynette Sharp was later arrested on July 13th, 2025 for Hindering Prosecution of Terrorism; See arrest warrant 413-7-12-25B. At the time of this call for service, both Lynette and Susan were released from investigative detention. See attached image from Deputy's BWC;

John Thomas Arrest

16. On July 10th, 2025, I arrested one, John Thomas for Smuggling of Persons. Investigators knew John Thomas to be the roommate of SONG and co-defendant, Joy Gibson, a person whom was arrested on the scene of for Terrorism and Aggravated Assault on Public Servant. Subsequent to the arrest of John Thomas, he was custodially interviewed several times with the presence of his attorney. John Thomas cooperated significantly with the investigation and provided several items of fact which aided in joining intelligence and timeline gaps.

17. In reference to Susan Kent, hereafter styled defendant, and Lynette Sharp, John Thomas provided information which I believe to be credible and reliable. John Thomas provided a verbal confession to his involvement and ultimate Smuggling of SONG from Alvarado back to Dallas. John Thomas provided ("FBI") and I with significant factual information which affirmatively linked defendant and Lynette Sharp to the overall conspiracy and successful facilitation to SONG's escape from Alvarado to Dallas. John Thomas only knew defendant as "Easy" and did not know her legal name.

Days Inn Cleburne

18. During the custodial interview with John Thomas, the following timeline of events was provided to ("FBI") and I over the course of several interviews. On July 5th, 2025, John Thomas indicated he received an encrypted message from Lynette via Signal. Signal is an end-to-end encrypted chat commonly utilized by individuals whom intend to mitigate digital footprints in communication, and furthermore mitigate digital communication as it relates to criminal acts.

19. John Thomas indicated Lynette did not provide specific details via the chat, however, requested he met her at the Days Inn located at 2005 N Main St. Cleburne, TX 76033; See attached image(s) on following page:

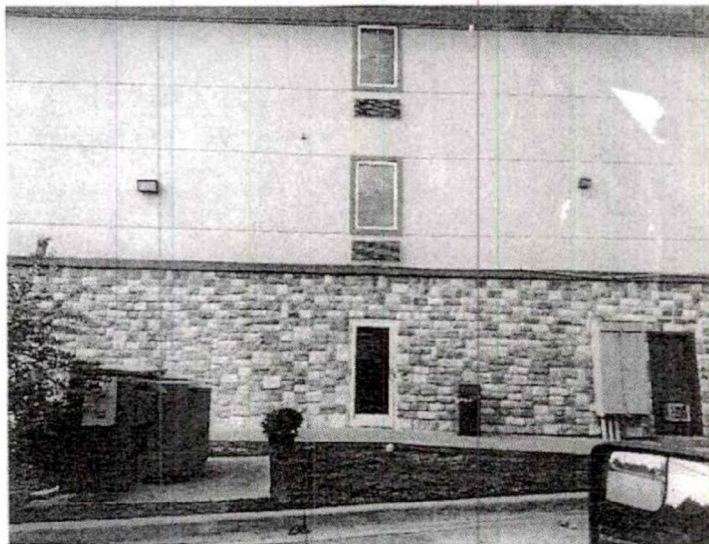

20. John stated upon his arrival to the Days Inn, he was let in via the side door on the North side of the hotel parking lot and would ultimately go into room #105; See attached image(s):

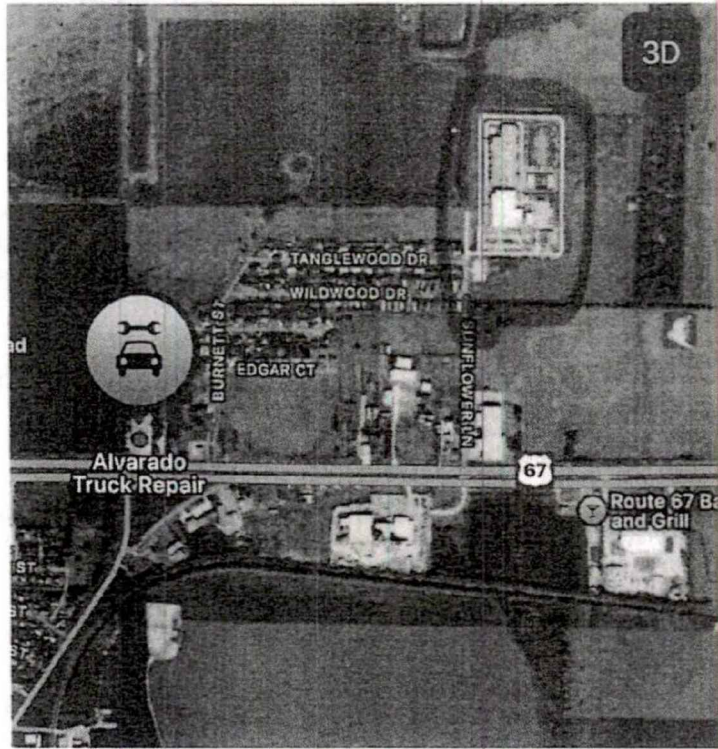

21. John Thomas indicated those present in the hotel room were, "Hippie" later identified as Lynette Sharp, "Easy", later identified as defendant, and two other unknown females, totaling five (5) persons inside of the hotel room including John Thomas. In summary, John Thomas learned "Hippie" and "Easy" had gone to the Johnson County Jail earlier in the day as mentioned previously in this affidavit with an image depicting Lynette Sharp and Susan Kent; For all intents and purposes of this affidavit, "Hippie" will be referred to as Lynette and "Easy" will be referred to as defendant.

22. John Thomas indicated Lynette had established intermittent communication with SONG, who was then hiding out in a Sun Flower field near the Prairieland Detention Center; Given the time provided by John Thomas this interaction at Days Inn occurred almost 24 hours after the initial incident. John indicated defendant provided him with water and snacks to give to SONG if/when he picked him up from Alvarado. John indicated he personally did not have communication with SONG and all communication with SONG was explicitly through Lynette via Signal.

23. John Thomas indicated he, Lynette, and defendant all went outside to their vehicles. John Thomas stated defendant informed him he could unload all of the items from his trunk into her vehicle; The purpose of this was to create space in John Thomas' trunk for SONG to fit in when he picked him up from Alvarado, effectively creating a nexus to defendant aiding John Thomas in the Smuggling of SONG and in turn contributing to the Hindering of SONG's arrest. John stated Lynette drove with him to Alvarado and he and Lynette both picked up SONG from Alvarado truck repair. John Thomas stated they initially parked at a bar and grill located on US Highway 67 while Lynette communicated with SONG. Based on the statements provided by John Thomas, I conducted a map search of Alvarado Truck Repair, which shows its proximity to Prairieland and the bar and grill where he and Lynette staged prior to pickup up SONG; See image of map on following page:

24. On July 31st, 2025, ("TFO") Brashear and I went to the Johnson County Jail and showed John Thomas the image depicting Lynette and Susan as published earlier in this affidavit. John Thomas affirmatively identified defendant depicted as the person on the right. Based on the facts, evidence, and information contained herein this affidavit, I believe and have reason to believe, probable cause exists that defendant is in violation of laws of this State and the United States.

Limited Statement of Probable Cause

25. I submit this affidavit in support of a criminal complaint alleging Susan Kent to be in violation of laws of this state, particularly, Texas Penal Code 71.02, Engaging in Organized Criminal Activity. The material contained herein this affidavit is based on my personal investigation into the offense and information received several Special Agents, Analyst, and Task Force Officers from the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Dallas Field Office.

26. Because this affidavit is submitted for the limited purpose of establishing probable cause to support a criminal complaint, I have not included every fact discovered through this investigation. I have set forth the facts I believe and have reason to believe are necessary to establish probable cause that defendant, Susan Kent did intentionally and knowingly commit the offense described herein.

27. I believe and have reason to believe, Susan Kent, with the intent to establish, maintain, or participate in a combination or in the profits of a combination, the combination consisting of the defendant, Lynette Sharp, John Thomas, and two unidentified females, who collaborated in carrying on criminal activity, intentionally and knowingly commit the offense of Texas Penal Code 20.05, Smuggling of Persons, as described in subsection (17) of this statute.

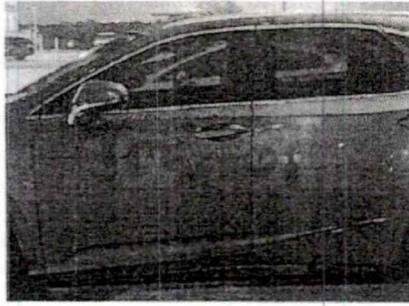

Based on the evidence at the scene it appears the rifle with the binary trigger was pulled four (4) times, discharging 8 rounds, suspect retreated backwards, and pulled the binary trigger an additional two (2) times, discharging 3 more rounds, with the final round being stove piped or "jamming" the rifle before it was discarded.

Suspect Apprehension and Evidence Collection

6. Subsequent to the above-mentioned incident, a large law enforcement response was prompted. The Johnson County Sheriff's Office, Alvarado Police Department, Venus Police Department, Joshua Police Department, Texas Department of Public Safety, Texas Game Warden, and Mansfield Police Department all responded. During the course of the active scene all defendants indicated above were apprehended either on scene or within a reasonable and prudent distance of the scene. All defendants were wearing black, paramilitary style clothing. Multiple military style ballistic vests, Kevlar helmets, and firearms were located scattered across the crime scene and/or in vehicles associated with suspects arrested; See attached exhibits:

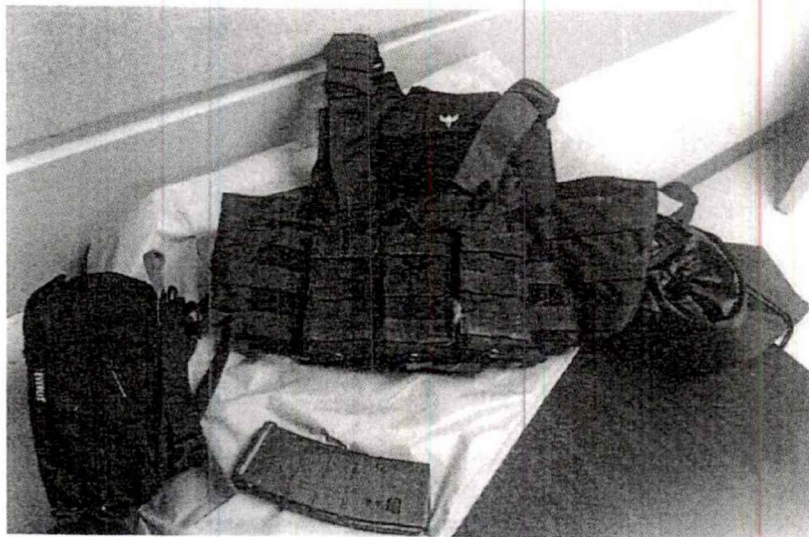

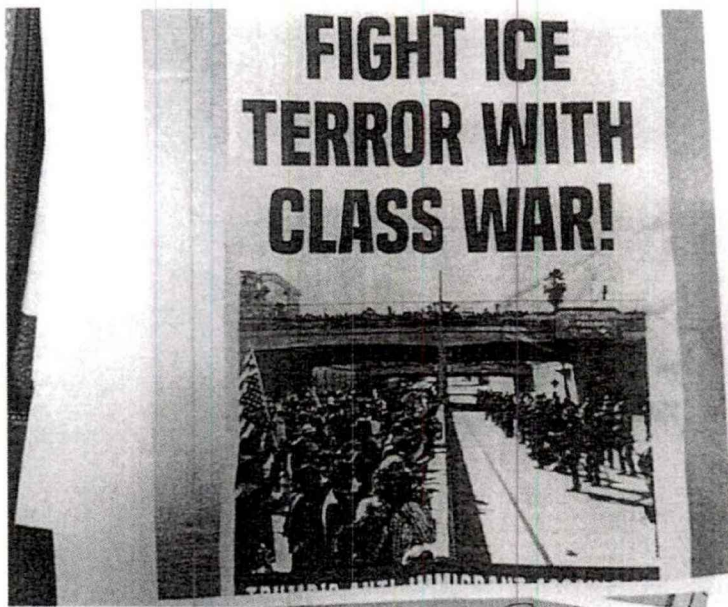

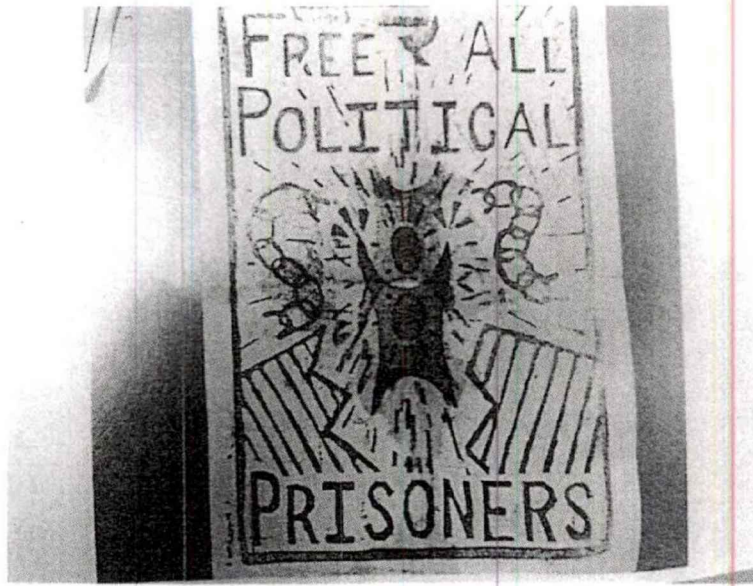

Traffic Stop & Suspect Connection

8. During my response to the scene of the offense, I was notified of a [REDACTED] van fleeing the scene offense. I conducted a traffic stop of said van near the intersection of US Highway 67 and North Cummings Rd; Roughly 1 mile from the Prairieland Detention Facility. During the traffic stop, I contacted co-defendant, Meagan Morris, DOB [REDACTED] AKA "[REDACTED] Morris." While speaking with Morris, Deputy Parsons identified a unholstered Sig Sauer Pistol in plain view on the passenger floor board of the vehicle. It is important to note Morris was dressed in all black attire and had the loaded magazine for the pistol located on the floor board in her pocket.

9. Morris was asked if there were any additional weapons in the vehicle to wit she stated there was an AR-15 style rifle in the backseat. Morris was asked to exit the vehicle and placed under investigatory detention. A terry frisk was conducted which is how I discovered the aforesaid pistol magazine in her pocket. In accordance with United States Supreme Court case law Carroll V United States AKA "motor vehicle exception" a warrantless probable cause search of the vehicle was conducted. The probable cause search of the vehicle elicited the discovery of two (2) black ballistic vests with loaded AR-15 magazines, a military/police style hand-held radio, an AR-15 style rifle, and a black ballistic Kevlar helmet.

10. Morris was read her Miranda warning which she initially waived her rights to an attorney and to remain silent. In summary, Morris provided the following information:

- She stated her friends asked her to watch the vehicle subsequent to a protest that occurred;
- She doesn't remember the names of her friends and met them online;
- She stated her cell phone was in one of her friends' care, custody, and control;
- She stated the "plan" was to "make some noise" at the gate;
- She stated the firearms in the vehicle are hers.

Benjamin SONG

11. On July 8th, 2025, I learned from ("FBI") Task Force Officer ("TFO") Casey Brashear that several of the firearms recovered at the scene were registered to one, Benjamin SONG, DOB [REDACTED], hereafter referred to as "SONG." ("TFO") Brashear informed me this was discovered via a Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms trace.

12. One of the AR-15 style rifles located at the scene of the original crime scene had a binary trigger. A binary trigger is used to "double" a regular rate of fire, essentially closing a gap between semi and fully automatic. The Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms ("ATF") confirmed the AR-15 style rifle had a binary trigger upon inspection. The Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco and Firearms trace for this rifle showed to be owned by SONG.

13. On July 8th, 2025, an agent with the Federal Bureau of Investigation ("FBI") spoke with one of the suspects at the Johnson County LEC, still under Miranda, continuing to waive her rights to remain silent and have an attorney present. The suspect told the Special Agent that defendant travelled with her to Prairieland Detention center on the night of the attack, July 4th, 2025. While waiting with the vehicles the suspect stated she heard the gunfire and knew it was from the rifle with the binary trigger; Firearm confirmed to be registered to SONG. The suspect knew the sound of gunfire from the binary trigger because he had accompanied SONG to the firing range on multiple occasions where defendant used the rifle with the Binary trigger.

14. Based on the facts and information contained above, I applied for and obtained three (3) State arrest warrants against SONG for Aiding the Commission of Terrorism, Aggravated Assault of Public Servant, and Engaging in Organized Criminal Activity. Contemporaneously, I learned ("FBI") obtained a Federal arrest warrants for SONG on charges of Attempted Murder of a Federal Officer; Discharging a Firearm During, in Relation to, and in Furtherance of a Crime of Violence.

Suspicious Person(s) Call for Service

15. On July 5th, 2025 at around 0837 hours, Johnson County Deputies responded to the Johnson County Jail in reference to two female subjects on site attempting to gather information about the individuals arrested on July 4th, 2025. Both females were identified as Lynette Sharp, DOB [REDACTED] and Susan Kent, DOB [REDACTED]. Lynette Sharp was later arrested on July 13th, 2025 for Hindering Prosecution of Terrorism; See arrest warrant 413-7-12-25B. At the time of this call for service, both Lynette and Susan were released from investigative detention. See attached image from Deputy's BWC;

John Thomas Arrest

16. On July 10th, 2025, I arrested one, John Thomas for Smuggling of Persons. Investigators knew John Thomas to be the roommate of SONG and co-defendant, Joy Gibson, a person whom was arrested on the scene of for Terrorism and Aggravated Assault on Public Servant. Subsequent to the arrest of John Thomas, he was custodially interviewed several times with the presence of his attorney. John Thomas cooperated significantly with the investigation and provided several items of fact which aided in joining intelligence and timeline gaps.
17. In reference to Susan Kent, hereafter styled defendant, and Lynette Sharp, John Thomas provided information which I believe to be credible and reliable. John Thomas provided a verbal confession to his involvement and ultimate Smuggling of SONG from Alvarado back to Dallas. John Thomas provided ("FBI") and I with significant factual information which affirmatively linked defendant and Lynette Sharp to the overall conspiracy and successful facilitation to SONG's escape from Alvarado to Dallas. John Thomas only knew defendant as "Easy" and did not know her legal name.

Days Inn Cleburne

18. During the custodial interview with John Thomas, the following timeline of events was provided to ("FBI") and I over the course of several interviews. On July 5th, 2025, John Thomas indicated he received an encrypted message from Lynette via Signal. Signal is an end-to-end encrypted chat commonly utilized by individuals whom intend to mitigate digital footprints in communication, and furthermore mitigate digital communication as it relates to criminal acts.
19. John Thomas indicated Lynette did not provide specific details via the chat, however, requested he met her at the Days Inn located at 2005 N Main St. Cleburne, TX 76033; See attached image(s) on following page:

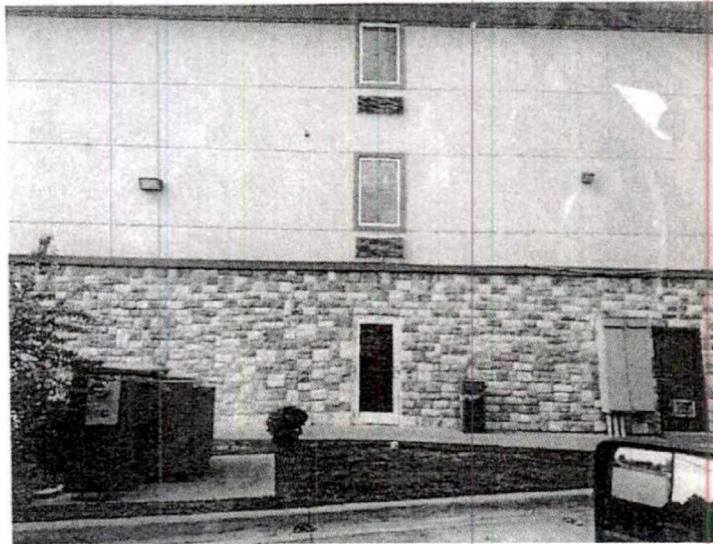

20. John stated upon his arrival to the Days Inn, he was let in via the side door on the North side of the hotel parking lot and would ultimately go into room #105; See attached image(s):

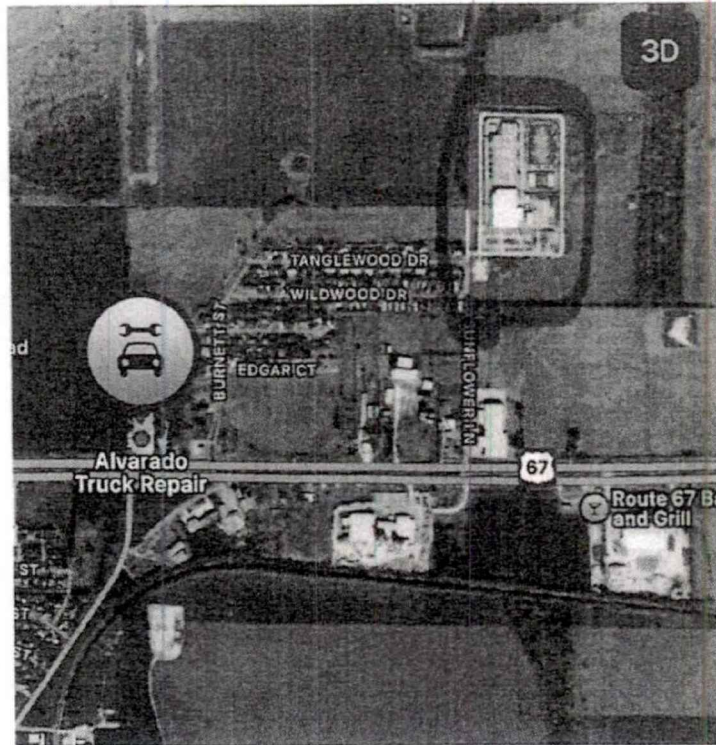

21. John Thomas indicated those present in the hotel room were, "Hippie" later identified as Lynette Sharp, "Easy", later identified as defendant, and two other unknown females, totaling five (5) persons inside of the hotel room including John Thomas. In summary, John Thomas learned "Hippie" and "Easy" had gone to the Johnson County Jail earlier in the day as mentioned previously in this affidavit with an image depicting Lynette Sharp and Susan Kent; For all intents and purposes of this affidavit, "Hippie" will be referred to as Lynette and "Easy" will be referred to as defendant.

22. John Thomas indicated Lynette had established intermittent communication with SONG, who was then hiding out in a Sun Flower field near the Prairieland Detention Center; Given the time provided by John Thomas this interaction at Days Inn occurred almost 24 hours after the initial incident. John indicated defendant provided him with water and snacks to give to SONG if/when he picked him up from Alvarado. John indicated he personally did not have communication with SONG and all communication with SONG was explicitly through Lynette via Signal.

23. John Thomas indicated he, Lynette, and defendant all went outside to their vehicles. John Thomas stated defendant informed him he could unload all of the items from his trunk into her vehicle; The purpose of this was to create space in John Thomas' trunk for SONG to fit in when he picked him up from Alvarado, effectively creating a nexus to defendant aiding John Thomas in the Smuggling of SONG and in turn contributing to the Hindering of SONG's arrest. John stated Lynette drove with him to Alvarado and he and Lynette both picked up SONG from Alvarado truck repair. John Thomas stated they initially parked at a bar and grill located on US Highway 67 while Lynette communicated with SONG. Based on the statements provided by John Thomas, I conducted a map search of Alvarado Truck Repair, which shows its proximity to Prairieland and the bar and grill where he and Lynette staged prior to pickup up SONG; See image of map on following page:

24. On July 31st, 2025, ("TFO") Brashear and I went to the Johnson County Jail and showed John Thomas the image depicting Lynette and Susan as published earlier in this affidavit. John Thomas affirmatively identified defendant depicted as the person on the right. Based on the facts, evidence, and information contained herein this affidavit, I believe and have reason to believe, probable cause exists that defendant is in violation of laws of this State and the United States.

Limited Statement of Probable Cause

25. I submit this affidavit in support of a criminal complaint alleging Susan Kent to be in violation of laws of this state, particularly, Texas Penal Code 76.04, Hindering Prosecution of Terrorism. The material contained herein this affidavit is based on my personal investigation into the offense and information received several Special Agents, Analyst, and Task Force Officers from the Federal Bureau of Investigation's Dallas Field Office.
26. Because this affidavit is submitted for the limited purpose of establishing probable cause to support a criminal complaint, I have not included every fact discovered through this investigation. I have set forth the facts I believe and have reason to believe are necessary to establish probable cause that defendant, Susan Kent did intentionally and knowingly commit the offense described herein.
27. I believe and have reason to believe, Susan Kent, with intent to hinder the arrest of Benjamin Song for an offense under Section 76.03 of the Texas Penal Code, provide or aid in providing Benjamin Song with the means of effecting escape.


